MacArthur Airport to get \$14.11M from FAA

Long Island MacArthur Airport will get \$14.11 million from the Federal Aviation Administration, as part of federal infrastructure funding.

The airport will use the money to upgrade the main terminal building utilities and fire and life-safety systems to comply with current building codes and provide greater energy efficiency. The improvements include installing a new generator to ensure continuous and efficient operation of the terminal and maintenance building, according to an FAA statement.

The funding announced Thursday is from the Airport Terminal Program, one of three aviation programs created by the bipartisan Infrastructure Law, which provides \$1 billion annually for five years for airport terminal grants.

"The work that goes into building safer, more accessible and sustainable terminals will provide opportunities for people across the nation," FAA Deputy Administrator A. Bradley Mims said in the statement. "The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law is a critical investment not only in our nation's infrastructure, but an investment in the future of our country's workforce."

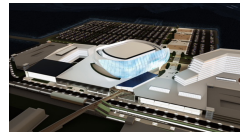
